Basic Tips: What You Should Do

- Please remember that we no longer use the designation of "freshman" for students in their first year of collegiate studies, instead referring to them as "first-year students."
- Encourage students to take advantage of our multiple inperson and virtual experiences for prospective students. We are offering virtual general information sessions for the University, college-specific information sessions (department focus), and virtual tours. We host Open House weekends in the fall, spring, and summer, which you can learn more about at **drexel.edu/undergrad/visit**. Our Admissions team is offering times to chat one on one with students as well. Students can contact their counselor at **drexel.edu/undergrad/contact/ representatives**.
- Encourage students to apply in the fall. Remind students of application deadlines (see Deadlines section). The bulk of our applications come in during the fall.
- If students have questions about a particular major, encourage them to visit the course catalog at **catalog.drexel.edu**.

- 2021 first-year enrolled: 2,831 students from 36 states and 67 countries
- 32 percent fall in the top 10 percent of class rank

*Note: Drexel adopted a Test-Optional policy as a response to the COVID-19 pandemic for the fall of 2021; we plan to continue to offer that policy for fall 2023. This policy allows students to choose whether to have test scores included as part of their admission application. Students will indicate on their admission application if they will be supplying test scores for consideration.

Academic Scholarships

• Merit scholarships are available to academically qualified students. Students are automatically reviewed for these awards when they apply. Students who apply under our Test-Optional Policy and choose not to submit test scores will receive the same consideration for merit-based scholarships as those applicants who do submit scores.

Need-Based Financial Aid

• Students will be reviewed for need-based aid with the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the CSS Profile. The FAFSA is used to award federal and state aid (including Pennsylvania) and is only for domestic students, while the CSS Profile is used to award Drexel institutional aid and is for both domestic and international students. Deadlines

- November 1: Binding Early Decision and Non-Binding Early Action application due; decisions released in mid-December. Applicants applying to a BA/BS+MD Early Assurance Combined degree program must have all application materials submitted.
- November 15: Early Action and Early Decision CSS Profile due.
- January 15: Regular Decision applications due; decisions released by April 1.
- January 15: Tuition deposit due for admitted Early Decision students.
- February 15: Regular Decision CSS Profile due and FAFSA priority submission deadline for all applicants.
- May 1: Tuition deposit and housing deposit due for admitted Early Action and Regular Decision students.

Standardized Testing Requirements

Drexel is test optional for applicants to the fall of 2023, which allows students to choose whether to have test scores included as part of their admission application. First-year applicants applying for entry in fall 2023 will indicate on their admission application whether they will be supplying test scores for consideration. Students may submit results from one of the following:

- SAT Reasoning Test
- ACT Exam
- Two SAT subject test scores
- Two AP exam scores
- International Baccalaureate Diploma or two IB higher-level exam scores
- National Exam results

Please note that if students plan to submit the SAT and ACT, we consider the highest score across all SAT test dates and the highest section scores across each ACT test date.

Supplemental Materials

- Portfolios are required for Animation & Visual Effects, Architectural Studies, Architecture, Fashion Design, Game Design & Production, Graphic Design, Photography, and Digital Media and Virtual Production.
- Optional portfolios may be submitted for Art History, Design & Merchandising, Entertainment & Arts Management, Film & Television, Interior Design, Music Industry, Product Design, Screenwriting & Playwriting, Undeclared Design and Media, and User Experience and Interaction Design.
- Writing supplements are required for all College of Media Arts & Design students.
- Dance applicants are required to audition or submit a portfolio.
- BA/BS+MD applicants must submit the College of Medicine Supplemental Application and standardized testing results. They may be asked to interview.

Education Abroad

Every major at Drexel is preapproved to study abroad. We currently offer 140 programs in 35 different countries. To accommodate students' schedules, the Office of Global Engagement also offers programs during breaks and the summer.

Research

As a major R1-designated undergraduate research institution, Drexel enables students to begin research as early as their first year. The Students Tackling Advanced Research (STAR) program allows for first-year students to live on campus during the summer to do full-time paid research.

Entrepreneurship

The Charles D. Close School of Entrepreneurship is the nation's first freestanding school of entrepreneurship to offer degrees. They also oversee the Baiada Institute, an incubator lab that can help student business ideas get started.

Housing and Residence Life

First-year student housing is guaranteed. All first-year and second-year students are required to live on campus or in affiliated housing unless they live with their parents or guardians within 10 miles of the University. There are 8 residence halls; seven are reserved for first-year students, and Bentley Hall is home to Pennoni Honors College students. All residence halls are co-ed by floor or section. Housing deposits are due May 15. Visit **drexel.edu/housing** to learn more.

Student Activities and Athletics

Students can participate in intercollegiate athletics (contact coaches directly at **drexeldragons.com**), sports clubs, intramural sports, and a large number of religious, cultural, and academic clubs. More than 300 organizations are available; visit **drexel.edu/studentlife** to learn more.

Performing Arts

The University currently has over 20 different audition-required theater, dance, and music ensembles. All majors are welcome to participate in these programs. Seventeen of these groups offer additional scholarships to students, but require auditions prior to enrollment. Accelerated, combined, and bridge degree programs enable academically qualified students to pursue a more direct pathway to earning a bachelor's and advanced degree at Drexel. Prospective first-year applicants who meet the requirements set by Undergraduate Admissions may apply for an accelerated, combined, or bridge degree program. Current Drexel students may apply for some accelerated or bridge degree programs through the Graduate College after completing 90 credits but no more than 120 credits.
