

2024–2025 Domestic Student Financial Aid Appeal Request Instructions

Change in Circumstances

We know there may be times when your or your family's circumstances change unexpectedly. In cases where there has been an unforeseen change that creates a financial hardship, you may be able to receive assistance by using our appeal process.

Certain circumstances can be evaluated for additional financial resources on an emergency basis, such as those on the following page.

Completing the Financial Aid Appeal Request

Please take special note of the following requirements and procedures as you complete the appeal request:

- 1. For new students starting in the 2024–2025 academic year, to be considered for a review of Drexel institutional need-based aid, you must file a 2024–2025 CSS Profile by the deadline published for your application choice (new students only).
- 2. For new and continuing students, to be considered for a review of federal and/or state aid, you must file the 2024–2025 FAFSA at **fafsa.gov** and have received your financial aid award package.
- 3. Complete the following form in its entirety. Note that for each circumstance listed, there is additional documentation that you are required to provide. Appeal requests that lack the required documentation will not be reviewed.
- 4. Please make sure that your name and University ID number appear on each additional document.
- 5. Only submit tax or financial documentation that is specifically listed on the instructions for each type of scenario.
- 6. Please DO NOT submit copies of actual tax returns; we can only accept IRS Tax Return Transcripts, which can be ordered at **irs.gov/individuals/get-transcript**.
- 7. A letter from you and/or your parent/guardian should accompany your appeal request. This letter should contain detailed information about the change in your financial circumstances.

Recent Loss of Employment

- Copy of your and/or your parents' 2022 and 2023 IRS Tax Return Transcripts and W2s
- Proof of unemployment benefits eligible to receive
- Proof of any severance pay you or your parents received

Recent Reduction in Income

- Copy of your and/or your parents' 2022 and 2023 IRS Tax Return Transcripts and W2s
- Your or your parents' three most recent pay stubs

Recent Divorce/Separation

- Copy of your and/or your parents' 2022 and 2023 IRS Tax Return Transcripts and W2s
- Proof of divorce proceedings or legal separation

Recent Death of Parent or Spouse

- Copy of death certificate
- Copy of your and/or your parents' 2022 and 2023 IRS Tax Return Transcripts and W2s

Loss of One-Time Income

- Copy of your and/or your parents' 2022 and 2023 IRS Tax Return Transcripts and W2s
- Proof of one-time income source

Out-of-Pocket Medical/Dental Expenses Not Reported on FAFSA

• Documentation of expenses not covered by medical/dental insurance
