Standard Research Terms & Conditions

More...

In 2000, the Federal **Demonstration Partnership** (FDP), a cooperative initiative among numerous Federal agencies and institutional recipients of research funds aimed at reducing the administrative burdens associated with research grants and contracts, developed standard terms and conditions as a model implementation of OMB Circular A-110. These terms were an effective set of requirements for many agency research awards. Over the years, the standard Research Terms and Conditions (RTC) have been continuously updated as regulations evolved, including the OMB circulars and their subsequent replacement by the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards, 2 CFR 200 (Uniform Guidance). Numerous federal grantors have formally incorporated the RTCs into their award mechanisms for research and research-related grants made to institutions of higher education and nonprofit organizations, and more agencies are expected to adopt them going forward. The National Science Foundation (NSF) serves as the sponsor of the updated version of these RTCs. Read more ...
